## Love story

Writing in the catalogue of the Evelyn Williams' exhibition at **Martin Tinney Gallery**, Peter Wakelin compares the effect of her astonishing paintings and drawings to a "gleam like water from the deep well of her own self and cast into a mirror pool". These are reflections possessed of universal rather than personal qualities, so that they speak of all mothers and lovers, all panicked crowds and distressed individuals with the profoundest compassion.

Hers is a vision of love for, and an understanding of, the human condition that stands at the polar opposite to Lucien Freud for example, and one that, five years after her death in 2012, gets more and more tenderly and powerfully relevant to the present moment (think of all those images after Grenfell Tower).

One can only hope that the Tate curators who recently refused to accept one of her most remarkable pieces, 'Burning Man' (on the curious grounds that they could not see how to integrate it into future displays) may perhaps come to reconsider their decision. It is, meanwhile, a distinctly interesting moment for her reputation in other ways too with the inauguration, this month, of a £10,000 Evelyn Williams award within the Jerwood Drawing Prize to support an extended drawing 'project' and 2018/9 exhibition. The vision moves into the future.

## Painters unite

We have become so inured to the idea that 'good' art has to be defined by 'experts' – usually not themselves practising artists – that it is easy for artists to lose confidence in their validity. No group more so, perhaps, than painters where the barrage of 'painting is dead' critiques have been going on since the late 60s.

So it is good to see the painters now fighting back – Marcus Harvey's Turps Banana magazine and Elephant and Castle-based art school is one such example, Robert Priseman and Simon Carter's Contemporary British Painting another. Founded four years ago as an exhibiting and purchasing group, it has developed rapidly, moving from exhibitions in London churches to significant shows of 80 British painters' work, currently touring major Chinese art galleries and schools. There is also a painting prize; the 12 short listed artists (chosen by other painters) for the 2017 version are currently showing at **Stables Gallery**, Orleans House. The rewards to the winner are not insubstantial – a purchase prize of £2000 and a solo exhibition at Herrick Gallery not to mention, declaring an interest, a critical essay by myself – the final prize selection being the only time non-artists are allowed near the process! Meanwhile their website has all the artists and all the work.

## Family force

Common enough in the past – think the Breughels, the Gentileschis, the Pissarros or even, in early 20th century, the Nicholsons – families of artists have, for whatever reason, gone out of fashion in the current climate. All of which makes the 'Ramion and Family' exhibition – the collective title for the paintings, book illustrations, collage/photographic pieces, decorative art and, stretching it a bit, the poetry, of the Hinks/Haire family – currently showing at **The Cello Factory**, and such a delightful and refreshing throwback to earlier practices.

The title comes from the mythical world of stories – 'The Rock of Ramion' et al – that father Frank Hinks first told and then illustrated for his three sons, with the accomplished paintings coming from son Alexander, delightful decorated mirrors from son Ben and the poetry readings from son Julius. The photographed collages are by their mother, Susan Haire (president of the London Group) who also appears, affectionately, as the witch with the purple hair in the now successfully published 'Rock of Ramion' books.

The St Ives Festival spotlights several unmissable shows in Cornwall this month. In St Ives itself two adjacent galleries exhibit the very best of what identifies the town's creative tradition: Breon O'Casey at **New Craftsman Gallery** and Alice Mumford at **Belgrave St Ives**.

In 1959, inspired by a film about painter Alfred Wallis, Breon O'Casey (son of Irish playwright Sean O'Casey and his actress wife Eileen) joined the rearguard of the modernist maelstrom in St Ives where, first as assistant to sculptor Denis Mitchell and then to Barbara Hepworth, he developed his skills working both in two dimensions, painting and printmaking, and in a number of other disciplines, most notably sculpture, jewellery making and weaving.

Simplicity and truth to materials characterise his work, his fascination with abstraction never taking him far from motifs drawn from the natural world – so often a bird, stylised and simplified or, in his sculpture, the human figure. Six years after his death in 2011 Breon O'Casey can be identified as unique in the St Ives milieu for ploughing his own furrow and adhering only loosely to the defined 'isms' of contemporary art. At New Craftsman there is a chance to see how he did this in a range of the media in which he worked.

Born in Colombia, Alice Mumford is a painter; one who delights in her medium and is

intensely interested in the visual changes wrought by its application – a brush stroke here, a strip of colour there, another perhaps diagonally opposite. She studied art at Camberwell when chromatic sensibilities were still thought worth developing, and after a peripatetic childhood she settled in St Ives.

Where better for an artist fascinated by light and its interaction with colour and space? If you sense the South of France in her paintings, it is a nod no doubt to Matisse and Bonnard, two artists she acknowledges as an influence, and from whom she takes her lyrical, colourist style. From Bonnard in particular, comes the soft focus painterly impressionism that conjures a timeless moment, one of waking from a dream to wonder without thought, just presence in place. It is this meditative quality, this stillness and sense of place that give Alice Mumford's paintings their gravitas and their joy.

The radical nature of **Kestle Barton's** exhibitions can paradoxically seem at variance with their idyllic pastoral setting, and 'Togetherness: Notes on Outrage' is spot on in this sense. Inspired by architectural journalist Ian Nairn's condemnation of Subtopia, his term for the homogenisation of new towns built in the 1950s and 60s, the exhibition is part of a continuing research project begun at London's South Kiosk to

re-examine Nairn's critique and its relevance today.

The Kestle Barton show examines the Rural, one of Nairn's own categories, particularly sites in Cornwall of residential and business development through the work of photographer and installation artist Felicity Hammond and photographer Polly Tootal. Pieces by Shaun Badham are also included and it may be these that prove the most eye catching. From his work on the now defunct play parks themed around the 60s love affair with the space race, Badham has 'reconditioned' a climbing frame. Nostalgia for some, thought provoking none the less.

Since opening in 2012 **Tremenheere Gallery** has become an important focus for sculpture in Cornwall; with the opening of the new gallery in January this year, it provides purpose built exhibiting space for the Newlyn Society of Artists' twice yearly shows. Integral to the development of art in the region and with past members ranging from Stanhope Forbes to Terry Frost, the NSA shows are a pulsimeter for current work in the region, and with Galleries own Nicholas Usherwood making the selection in this Critic's Choice exhibition, miss it at your peril.

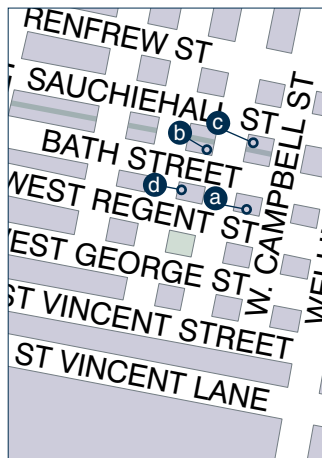

Avril Nicol's venture **&Gallery** in Edinburgh breaks the mold with exhibitions of work by artists based outside Scotland. The latest – of four younger abstract painters – is a good example, with three of them, Hanna ten Doornkaat, Ele Pack and Ellyn Lewis, based in London, Brighton and Cardiff respectively, with only London-born Jai Llewellyn working in Edinburgh. What richly varied takes on abstraction they are too –

from Llewellyn's rich, almost luscious, mark making suggestive of growth and decay, construction and destruction, and ten Doornkaat's layering of textural geometries imbued with sensations of memory, to Pack's organic and rhythmic overlays of paint, collage, pencil and metallics with its glimpses of hidden spaces, and Lewis' richly impasted surfaces bursting into vivid landscape form. **NU**

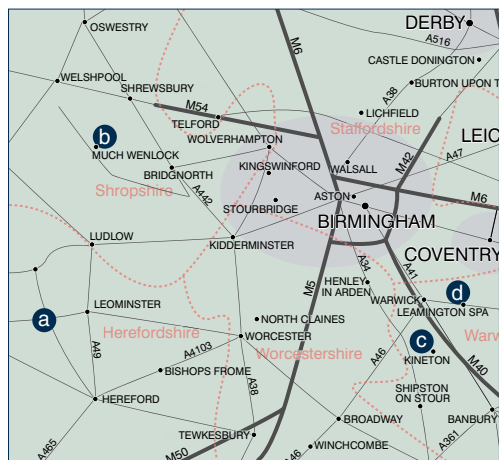

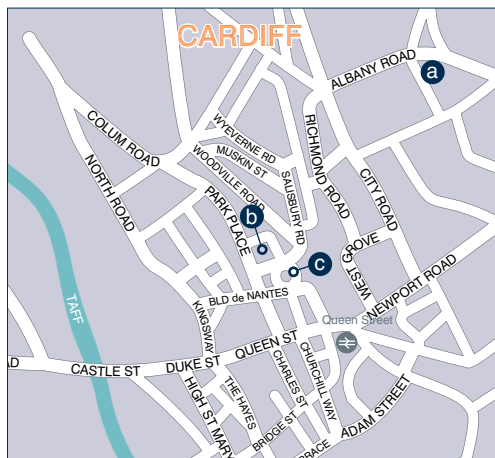

There's a wonderful sense of fresh air and wide open spaces pervading **Twenty Twenty's** pairing of Angie Lewin's breezy prints and Alex Malcolmson's nautically inspired boxes and painted wildlife sculpture. Lewin's work has, over the last two decades since her move to rural Norfolk, become almost more familiar to the public than her name as the studio/shop she and her husband established there in

1998, under the name St Jude's, developed her 50s inflected woodcut and linocut prints of gardens, wild flowers and still lifes into a lifestyle brand of textiles, cards and ceramics. Going back to the prints here reminds you just how gifted a creator she remains while her eye for other artists to show under the St Jude's banner is no less sharp – Malcolmson's work is dense with feeling and entirely unsentimental.

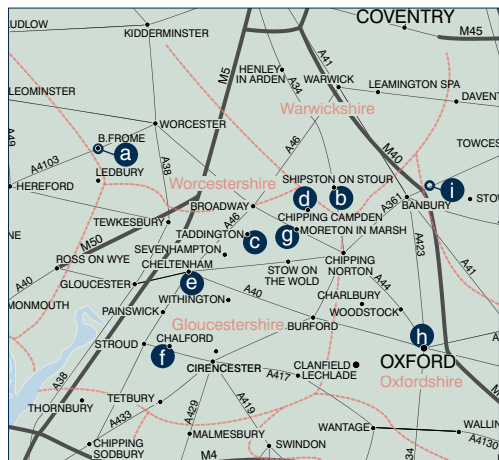
Born in 1947 in Blackburn, Mike Holcroft trained with that hotbed of progressive young painters who moved through Walthamstow College of Art en route to the Royal College in the early 1970s. An exhibiting career in the UK and Europe followed before he and his wife Rosemary returned to Lancashire and, a few years back, set up the **Water Street Gallery**, in Todmorden, a small, former mill town in the heart of the Pennines.

It is this intensely dramatic landscape which would now seem, increasingly, to lie at the heart of the way his art has developed over the last few years, in particular his large scale graphite and oil pastel drawings where, working in both observational and imaginative modes, he creates images that are not only powerfully expressive but also emotionally truthful in effect.

Fashion and Art. The two, a pair which traditionally and historically seek inspiration from one another, but at the same time, in the case of Mayfair, the galleries continue to jostle with the international retail brands for space.

As the retailers acquire further spaces on the area's famed streets, they are creating visual masterpieces, experiential stores where one visits over an afternoon. The space as well as the content is the attraction, something which has not escaped the galleries as well as the retailers – for example this spring Galerie Thaddaeus Ropac opened at Ely House in Dover Street. New York architect Annabelle Selldorf remodelled the imposing listed 18th century mansion of 16,000 square feet into five floors of elegant separate galleries.

Following the trend, galleries and museums are thinking beyond the traditional preview nights, followed by long term exhibitions, instead they are streaming their preview nights live, like the fashion week catwalk's, hosting shorter exhibitions and converting social media engagement into sales.

With so many retail and gallery flagships arriving, Mayfair is burnishing its crown as the leader of luxury in Europe. Dior, known as the Dior Town House, is a quintessential store evoking many a Parisian memory.

Meanwhile plans are fully underway for British fashion designer Stella McCartney as she moves her store from Bruton Street to Old Bond Street. The town house will feature three floors of retail space including a VIP suite overlooking Old Bond Street. Sitting elegantly across from Royal Arcade, the headquarters will operate from the remaining floors. Architect Househam Henderson is responsible for transforming the space, whose recent projects include Elie Saab. I did mention the courtyard, didn't I?

## THUMBnaïl

A day spent in a darkened room off Southwark Bridge Road recently looking at images of nearly 2000 prints confirmed for me (and I think, all my fellow selectors) that the current state of contemporary British printmaking is remarkably encouraging. ## House call

Interiors have traditionally been considered a woman's domain, much as 'unconventional' media have been the tools of scores of anonymous female artists – those women who sewed or weaved or otherwise engaged in 'crafts' rather than 'fine art'. Both domestic confinement and the use of a-canonical materials have also been offered as the reasons women's achievements, particularly in art, have gone unrecognised.

When Rachel Whiteread won the Turner Prize in 1993 she was the first woman to claim the prestigious award since it was launched at the Tate in 1984. Her winning piece, 'House', was a concrete cast of the interior of a terraced London home, a full-scale, mirror image of a deserted interior. Without playing overtly on either theme, Whiteread weaves the concept of the interior into works that use unusual media including plaster, concrete and resin. In one early work, she explains that her goal was "to mummify the air in the room" and her elaborate, large scale casts suggest immobilisation, the stilling of energy within the confines of a particular space.

Large or small, her works are neat encapsulations of inertia and often monuments to the stilling of talent or skill. Since 'House', the concept behind Whiteread's works has not changed significantly, but she is still considered a leading light of her generation of artists. She has

created some large scale public works, such as the 'Holocaust Memorial' in Vienna (2000), the interior of a library, down to books shown page – rather than spine – outwards. But she remains concerned with enclosure of lesser dimensions, also demonstrated in pieces such as her 2007 'Charity Box', which measures just 16 cm high.

Now, an upcoming survey at **Tate Britain** tracks Whiteread's career, including seminal works such as her 1995 installation of 100 resin casts of the underside of chairs 'Untitled (One Hundred Spaces)' and the 2003 piece 'Untitled (Room 101)', a cast of the room at the BBC thought to be the model for the room in Orwell's 1984: testaments to a creativity fully realised.

## Village life

To a greater or lesser extent artists seek out the company of other artists, often working and living in close proximity. If St Ives is the most familiar such colony then Ditching in Sussex, though familiar for its Beacon and St Dominic's Press, is not so but nevertheless it was home for 70 years to a close community of artists, craftspeople, weavers and carvers, three of whom founded the Catholic organisation The Guild of St Joseph & St Dominic for the promulgation of their talents and communal life.

Most famous was Eric Gill, influential through his eponymous typeface, Gill, Gill Sans, Perpetua

and 17 others, and lauded with many commissions for now iconic public sculptures.

Frank Brangwyn bought 'The Jointure' in Ditchling in 1917 four years after the starting of the Gill community, and while not a part of it, his national and international commissions gave him a more cosmopolitan outlook; he remained a village resident until his death in 1956.

While the original community buildings have gone, the village has a smart local museum in the old school and Brangwyn's former house is now a B&B with an art gallery in the former workshops, **Jointure Studios**. The museum has an important show 'Eric Gill: The Body' (ends 3 September) confronting issues in the light of an artist's sexuality.

Meanwhile Jointure Studios is hosting work by the late Carol Farrow, a creative innovator who in 'Crossing Boundaries' shows an appropriate melding of the divide between art and craft. This particularly in artefacts made in 'paperclay', her invention, which enabled light, large scale ceramic wall panels and latterly sculptural forms. Carol's paintings were rendered on her own bespoke hand made paper, allowing a realisation of her fascination with the contour and patina of decaying stone and woodwork bearing the scars of years of use.

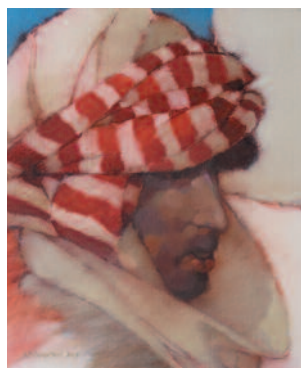

"I suspect like most figurative artists I find drawing and painting the human form wholly embedded with human behaviour. The desire to secure more than a representation of a person's movement, the spilling of light over contours or the various other physical facets is the reason we continue to make paintings. To liberate a recognisable small emotion in texture, colour and pattern and

to make it still, perhaps this is a measure of a successful painting. I like to work in acrylic because it allows me to experiment, making changes quickly is paramount when exploring options. This portrait is of a peddler with a box holding his wares, on an early February morning in India, which is why he was heavily clothed. Compared with British weather it was positively balmy."
